FOR YOUR OWN SAFETY AND THE SAFETY OF OTHERS, PLEASE BE ADVISED:



LIGHTENING & FOG: In the event of an electrical storm, suspend play immediately & take appropriate action. (Rule 6-8a applies). Do not commence or continue play in fog/poor visibility, when you cannot see the clear distance of your intended shot.



GREENS STAFF: **Have priority at all times** and should not be approached whilst any machinery is in operation. Players should always alert greens staff nearby or ahead when they are about to make a stroke that might endanger them.



THE COURSE IT'S STEPS AND SURFACES may be slippery when cold, damp or wet. Golfers must ensure to wear appropriate footwear to meet the prevailing conditions. Wherever possible, keep to Footpaths & Steps.



FIRST AID: Assistance is available in the Clubhouse. All accidents /dangerous occurrences which happen on the course during play should be reported to Eileen Moor, Ben Burlingham or Kathy Pick.



BUGGIES: To ensure the safety of all golf course users, buggy drivers and passengers are required to comply with the Club's Buggy Policy and follow designated buggy routes at all times.

For your own safety, use paths provided wherever possible.



HOLE 10 : Golfers intending to drive the 10th hole blind should not tee off until the notification bell has been sounded or they have visibly checked for clearance.

HOLE 6 & 10: When playing the 6th and 10th hole consideration should be given to the close proximity of the 5th and 16th greens respectively



DITCHES: Golfers should not venture in to ditches to retrieve balls

GOLFERS ARE REMINDED THAT THEY HAVE A DUTY OF CARE FOR THEMSELVES AND ALL OTHER COURSE USERS.



- **Players should not play until the players in front are out of range.**
- **Players should ensure that no one is standing close by or in a position to be hit by the club, the ball or any stones, pebbles, twigs or the like when they make a stroke or practice swing.**
- **If a player plays a ball in a direction where there is a danger of hitting someone, they should immediately shout a warning. The traditional word of warning in such situations is "FORE!"**
- **On hearing a shout of "Fore!" - Duck, cover your head with your arms and count to 10.**

You are advised to carry a mobile phone (*switched off*) to summon assistance in an emergency.

Dress Code

Acceptable

Hats and caps must be worn correctly – peaks facing forwards

Mens Polo shirts with collar and sleeves or golf-branded turtle neck

Ladies shirts/tops with collar or turtle neck. Can be sleeveless and worn outside shorts / trousers if so designed

Tailored shorts of appropriate length, long trousers, Ladies skirts, shorts of appropriate length or culottes

White ankle socks or trainer socks for Ladies and Gents

Golf Shoes

Golf Sandals may be worn with white socks

Not Acceptable

Hats and caps with peaks not facing forwards

Tee shirts

Football / Rugby shirts

Shirts not tucked in

Blue denim jeans or shorts

Cargo shorts

Beach shorts

Sports shorts

Bermuda shorts

Trousers tucked in socks or rolled up

Non sports socks

Football socks

Football / Rugby boots

Deck shoes



If you are not properly attired you will not be allowed on the course. **NO** hats in the Clubhouse. Mobile phones are to be switched **OFF** on the course.
